## 2023 Waste Disposal Calendar

[Inashiki City (Edosaki area)

Take your waste in the designated bag to the collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.

 Each household may take up to five bags of combustible waste to the collection point each collection day.

Tie the designated bag and place it in the designated area.

It's against the law to leave recyclables with other waste!!



\* There is a special collection day on December 30. Please note that due to the New Year's holiday from January 1st to 3rd, the weekly collection cycle for all non-combustible trash and newspapers/magazines/cardboard will begin on the second week of the month Example items Disposal method Category Food waste / waste Remove excess liquid from kitchen refuse. Wood, branches Cloth, leather waste Plastic products Stained containers • Harden excess cooking oil or soak it up with paper or cloth. Leftover food, grass, Clothing, shoes, bags CD cases Mayonnaise containers Woodchips, small Disposable lighters Small branches must be no more than 50cm in length and 5cm in thickness and tied up in bundles dead leaves branches, wooden toys langers / buckets, etc Combustible when left at the collection point. However, to dispose of more than five bundles at once, please bring them to a collection center. waste Paper diapers must have excrement removed before disposal. Plastic products without a recycle mark, tissue paper, toilet paper, and post displaying personal information are classified as combustible waste. Remove the caps from empty bottles and rinse them with water. **Empty bottles Glass** (Metal and plastic caps must be disposed of separately.) **Bottles**, glass Cups, glass sheets, Liquor, beer, Wrap broken items like glass in newspaper or something similar when disposing of them to prevent soft drink bottles bulbs, light bulbs \*It is dangerous to make holes in spray cans. **Metals Empty cans** Small household electronics Porcelain and earthenware Soft drink cans, Spray cans and gas cylinders for tabletop stoves can explode, so always make sure they are completely empty. Saucepans, kettles, kitchen knives Rice cookers, telephones, Small bowls, plates gas cylinders for tabletop umbrellas, frying pans, dry cell batteries, hot water/hot drink pots clay pots • Wrap sharp objects like blades in newspaper or something similar when disposing of them to prevent injury. Metals es, spray cans, Please make sure cans are empty and rinse them with water. Some small household appliances can also be disposed of in boxes at certain collection points. 2 Item that fit into this category are marked with this symbol. **Bottles** Film Packs, cups, etc. Caps Polystyrene **Trays Plastic** These items must be emptied, rinsed with water and then drained. Generally collected at collection points. PET bottles are also collected on the collection day for containers plastic containers and packages. See the "PET bottles" section for disposal method. and packages All caps should be removed for safety (including PET bottle caps). Dispose of any plastic products that are permanently or badly stained and any products that are made of plastic but are not a container or packaging as combustible waste. Item that fit into this category are marked with this symbol. Paper cups Paper cartons, etc. Paper bags **Paper**  Please remove anything attached to plastic waste if it is not paper. If it cannot be removed, dispose of the item containers as combustible waste. Products processed with aluminium (the back side will be silver colored) should be disposed of as and cartons Dispose of any paper product that is badly stained as combustible waste. Dispose of by folding and putting into piles no more than 50cm in length or width and binding with Newspapers, Fliers Cardboard Magazines Newspapers, (Newspaper and fliers may also be disposed of in paper bags from newspaper delivery shops.) magazines, Make each bundle about 30cm tall. cardboard Bundle newspapers (fliers), magazines and cardboard separately. 














Make use of the recyclable collection activities by local groups!
